Carol Board-Westfall, Treasurer, reported a good balance to carry on the work of the society and Johanna Nutter read the minutes from the previous meeting. The society is continuing the process of identifying historic homes, churches and other buildings in Roane County to recognize with a plaque. The society is making plans to recognize Roane County's only U. S. Congressman with a memorial plaque which will include his likeness.
